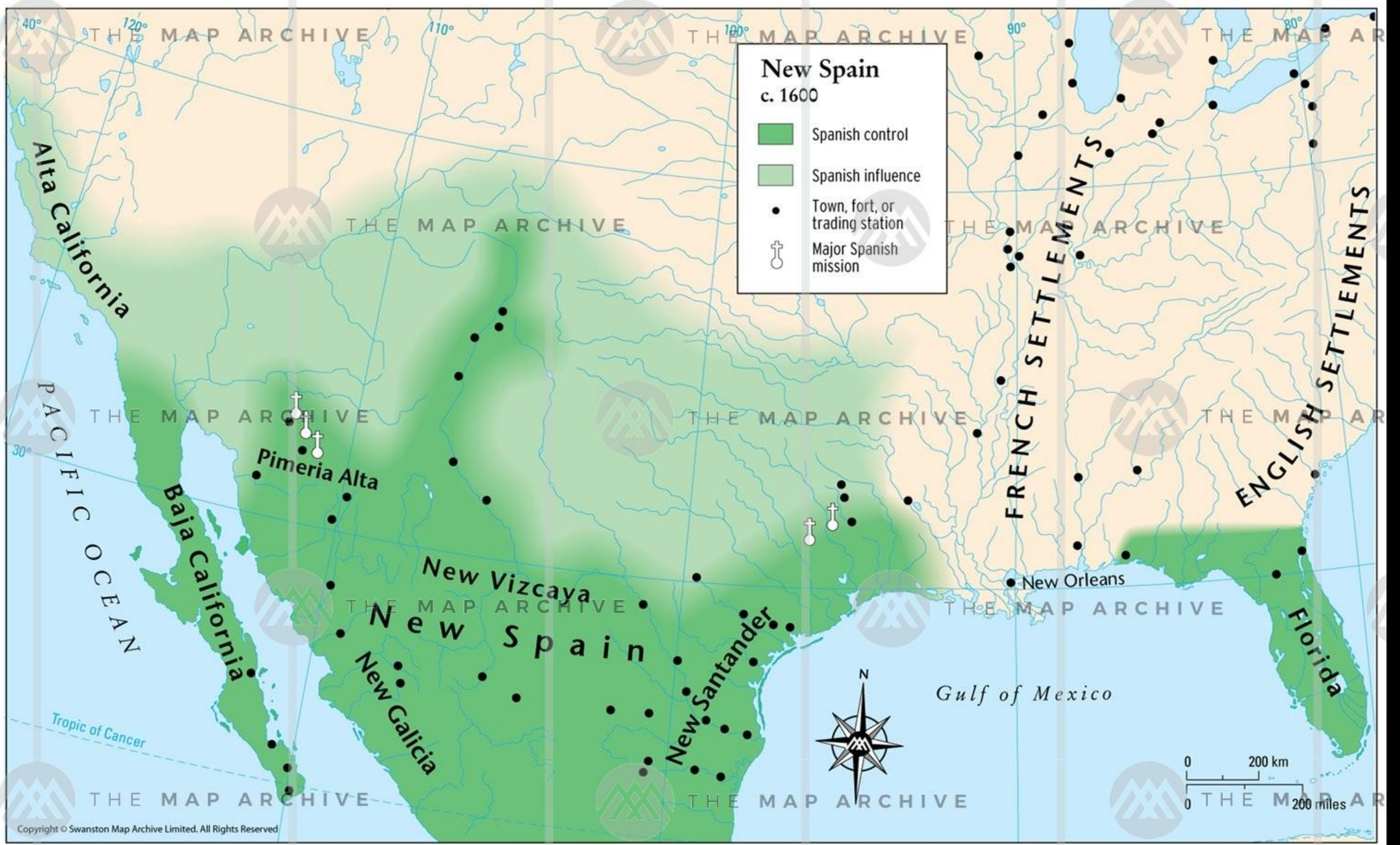

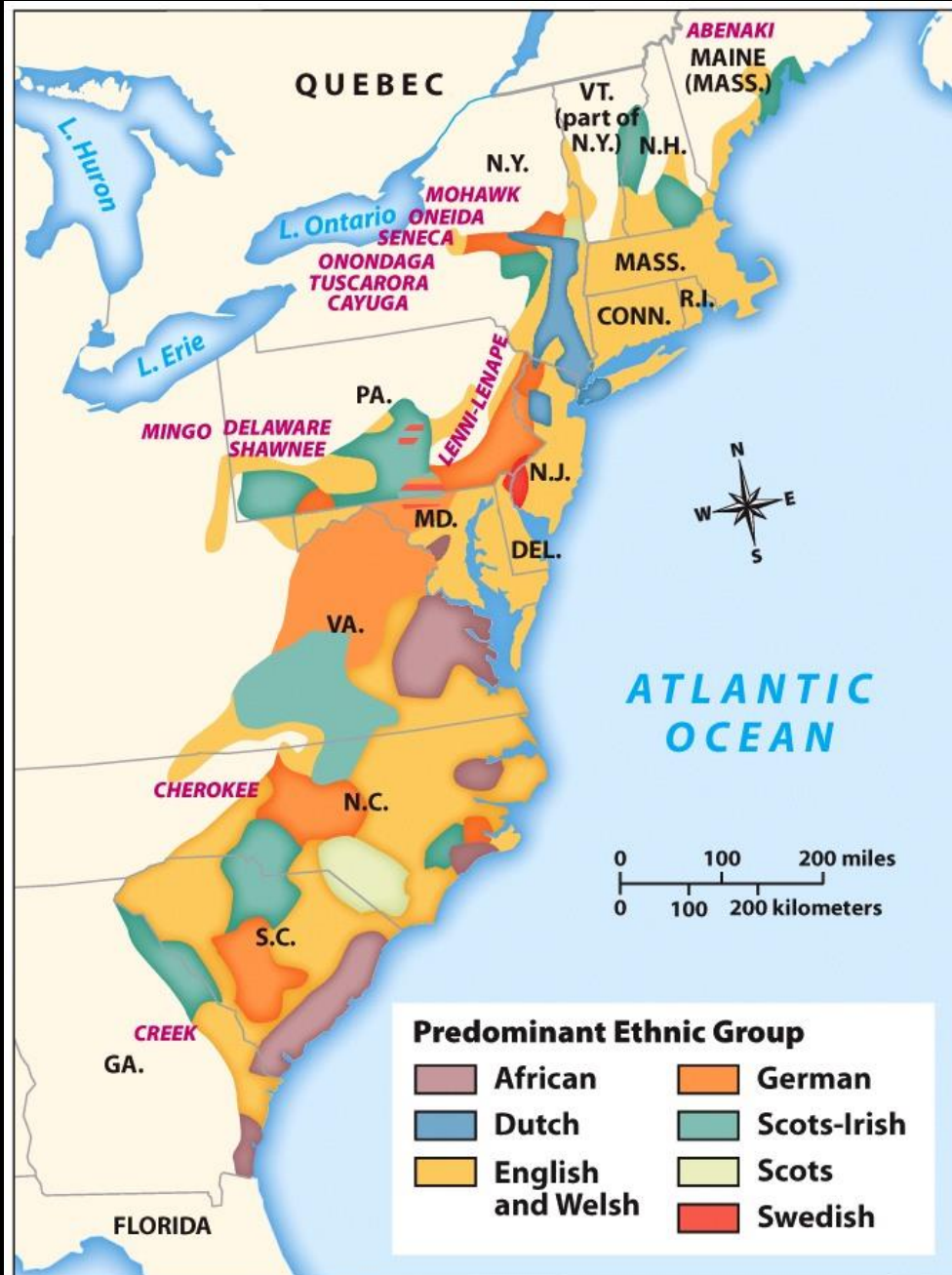
MAP 3.1 Chesapeake Colonies in the Seventeenth Century

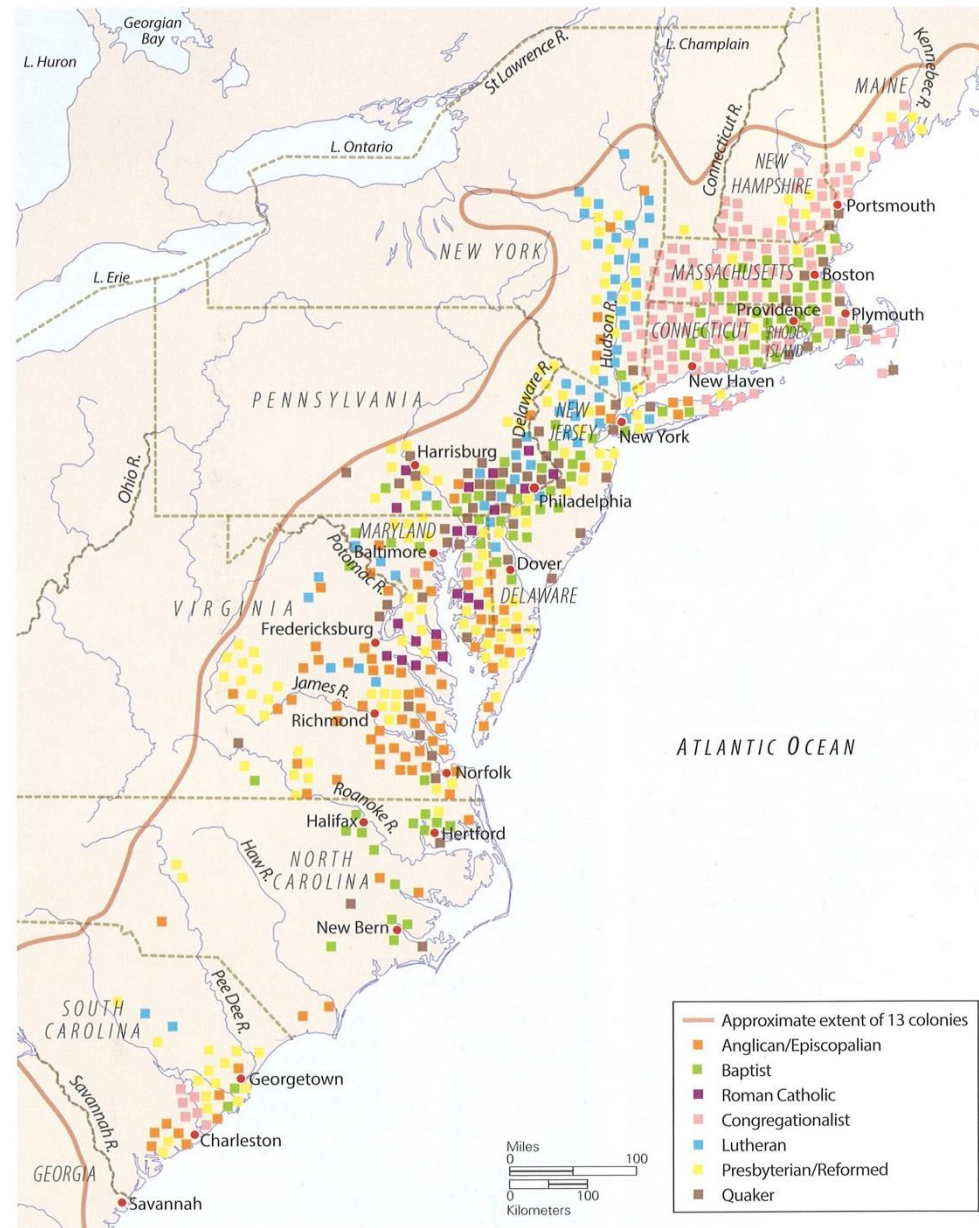
Map 4.3 American Colonies at the End of the Seventeenth Century
