

As a teenager, I always looked forward to the annual youth gathering called Resurrection. On a Friday afternoon each January, the entire youth group would pile into cars and church vans and head toward Gatlinburg. It was a weekend of faith, fun, and relationship-building as a youth group. Each year, the speaker would lead us in worship and challenge the gathered youth to examine our relationships with Christ.

It was at Resurrection in 2006 that I dedicated my life to Christ and the following year that I began to explore my call to ministry. Resurrection has been a place for youth to experience God on a spiritual mountain top for decades. Many of the young leaders



and clergy in Holston Conference have been shaped by Resurrection in some way.

Next weekend, our own Church Street youth will be making their own journey to Resurrection. This can be a weekend of spiritual significance and will be a time of worship with thousands of other youth.

shoes you have donated provide a life-changing solution: a good pair of shoes.

They provide individuals in developing countries the ability to start small businesses. They sell these shoes. Your donated shoes give a powerful and sustainable way for people to lift themselves and their families out of poverty.

In many developing nations, walking is the primary mode of transportation. Every day, millions are exposed to unsanitary conditions that lead to diseases. This keeps children out of school leaving them without an education and continuing the cycle of poverty. Since 2006, S4S has kept 51 million pounds of shoes and clothing out of landfills and instead created opportunities for people in need around the globe.
