

# **Heritage and Friends Day: May 22**

**Educate:** Did you know that Church Street UMC is the oldest Methodist church in Knoxville? In May 1816, Tennessee Supreme Court Judge, banker, and U.S. Senator Hugh Lawson White executed the deed donating land for the first Methodist church, called "White's Chapel". By 1834 the congregation had moved to a site on Church Street, thus the origin of the church's name. The history of CSUMC is rich and faithful. You can learn more about the history of the church at:

## **Jim Bailes Returns**



Jim was honored with the Denman Evangelism Award from the Holston Conference in 1991, and is well known for his passion for urban ministry.
