### **Discover Church Street**




# Holy Land Trip Meeting

### From the Pastor

Following our two morning worship services this past Sunday, I along with many of you began to hear the tragic news of the mass shooting in Orlando, Florida. This hate crime targeting the LGBTQ Community, the number of lives lost, and those injured is beyond what words can describe. It points again to the level of hate not only around the world, but right here in our own communities. Moreover, the need for greater gun control always leads to heated debates which bring more expressions of anger and frustration.

In my devotion time this past Monday morning, I have found these words from Dr. C.H. Spurgeon to be most helpful. "You may expect

that between here and heaven, if you have not met with it yet, you will have enough trouble to destroy you unless the Lord is your Helper."

Lord in your mercy! We need your help. From Psalms 124:1 and 4, "If it had not been the Lord who was on our side...then the waters would have overwhelmed us, the stream would have gone over our soul." Lord in your mercy pour over the families affected by this horrific tragedy, the first responders, the people of Orlando and all of us that so much need help this day.

### **Holston Annual Conference**

Holston's Annual Conference concluded last week on Wednesday, June 8, and I am pleased to share that all five of your appointed clergy were reappointed to Church Street. We all feel most blessed and humbled to share in ministry with you as we celebrate 200 years as a worshipping congregation.


The theme of Annual Conference was *Bless*. The Conference blessed Zimbabwe and Liberia with over 9,000 kits/buckets consisting of school kits, health kits and food buckets with a cash value of \$221,334. An offering of over \$100,000 was given to help with Children's Poverty issues around the Holston Conference. Other Actions: Approved a 2017 budget of \$9.4 million. This represents a decrease of about \$900,000 from this year 2016.

Camping Ministry continues to form and mold young people's lives. Worship Services were inspirational and Bishop Looney led us in Bible Study in a beautiful way.

We heard reports from all across our varied ministries of the Holston Conference. We celebrated the 60th anniversary of women in ordained ministry, 20th anniversary of full membership for ordained deacons, 24 persons were licensed as local pastors, 8 persons were commissioned Provisional Elders, 1 person Associate Member, 1 Ordained Deacon, and 8 persons ordained Elder in The United Methodist Church.

Our own Nicole Krewson was one of the winners of the 5K fundraiser for children. You can find a more detailed report on the Holston.org website. General Conference and Holston Annual Conference are now in the books. One more conference to go, the Southeast Jurisdictional Conference, is July 12-15. This is where the bishop elections will take place.
