Building for Christ Update


This week, our construction management firm Johnson & Galyon hosted many potential sub-contractors for the building project at the church so that they could view spaces, ask questions and get the information they need to prepare cost estimates. The church will receive Johnson & Galyon's bid later this month.

An information session, hosted by our architects, Hartman-Cox, will be held on Sunday, March 26th in Parish Hall (time to be determined).



There will be a church conference to vote on the building project immediately after the 11 a.m. service on Sunday, April 2. Your input, ideas, prayers and support are greatly appreciated this month as we move into the discussion and project approval process. If approved, construction will begin the week after

Easter and is estimated to take 14 months.
