### - CLERGY CORNER -

#### Let's Think Together about ... forming our faith through our public worship of God

On Sunday morning, August 26, I had the wonderful opportunity to speak and offer the sacrament of Holy Communion at the Youth Choir Retreat. I arrived at 8:20 a.m., a few minutes late, to find 42 youth, 5 college students, and a number of adult chaperons and leaders seated and ready to begin their second day of rehearsals.

When I spoke with Tim Ward about preparing to speak to the youth and preside at communion, I asked him if I needed to provide the responses in printed form. Tim said he didn't think so, because the youth knew the responses through their regular participation in worship. I was impressed. Indeed, I am impressed with the young people and children at Church Street. In particular, I'm impressed by the way our worship at Church Street is forming them in the faith.

In the world of liturgical studies scholars refer to worship as the place for theologia prima, Latin for "first theology." I shared with the youth that for me, this means that we are formed in the Christian faith first through the practice of public worship. At the beginning of our lives, or the beginning of our relationship with Christ, we are knit together into one body through the sacrament of Christian baptism. We first learn about who God is through the prayers we offer together as a community of faith. The majority of our understanding of the Wesleyan theological tradition comes to us through the hymns and prayers written by Charles and John Wesley, so we learn our Methodist theological heritage when we sing these songs in worship. We experience the real presence of the living God when we pray the Prayer of Great

Thanksgiving and then gather around the table to share in Holy Communion. As we kneel or stand to receive the bread and wine, we become mysteriously connected to Christ, to one another, to people of faith around the world, and even with those who have gone on to be seated at the great banquet in heaven and who have now joined the great cloud of witnesses. When we affirm our faith together by saying the Apostle's Creed or another one of our creeds, we are reminded of the longer tradition of which we are a part.

I give thanks for the Christian formation that is happening through worship at Church Street, and especially for the commitment of our young people, not just to singing, but to growing in discipleship through regular participation in the worship of God.
