# Reflections

### -Rev. Andy Ferguson

I want to remind you, as we approach the close of the Stewardship Campaign and the close of the year, how crucial our stewardship is.

Last Sunday, we hosted lectures by Dr. Jim Fleming on *Barriers the Early Church Faced.* As we crowded into the gym on Sunday morning, I was reminded of the unique work that this church is doing. Nowhere else in the course of our weeks and months is the Bible taught with both conviction and a critical eye. **The riches of the Christian faith require an informed congregation.** 

A couple of Sundays ago, I saw children carrying a craft they had made in Sunday School. It was a simple bit of artwork made of paper and glue and colors. But, as the children met their parents, they held up their artwork and told in their own words what it meant. Station yourself near the children's wing on any Sunday after Sunday School to watch the children telling their parents the stories of Jesus. **Teaching our children is one of the great tasks of the church; you see, the next generations depend on it.** 

On Friday, I dropped by the office. A needy person was there looking for help. Doris had stopped her work to help him get connected with our Benevolence Team. **The church, you see, is in the business of helping people**.

This church is about helping people. Needy people. Child-sized people who are growing up and are ready to be taught. People who are stirred to worship. People who come for prayer. The work of this church is not like any secular or commercial institution. There are people hungry to hear. **God must be glorified**. These are the reasons our stewardship is crucial.
