COMMUNITY There is a wonderful tradition of ecumenical partnering in the heart of Downtown Knoxville. Several churches, some with steeples, some that meet in unique settings downtown are involved in a monthly meeting of senior pastors that enjoy **TEN SERVICES** fellowship and common experience of downtown life. Out of these meetings opportunities have

emerged to worship together and share our common faith. One tradition for over a decade is to journey through Lent together during Wednesday Noon Worship. We travel to each steeple church for a 30 minute service of worship that begins at Noon, followed by a donation-based lunch in the fellowship hall of each setting. This is a great way to worship with other Christians in the city, discover commonalities across denominations, and to see the inside of the beautiful old steeple churches of Downtown Knoxville. A Lenten Bible Study will be offered each Wednesday evening beginning Feb. 20 at 7 p.m. in Room 201-A. We will study Kenneth Bailey's book, The Cross and the Prodigal. Bailey spent most of his working career in the Middle East, teaching in the Seminary in Beirut, Lebanon and teaching literacy in rural villages of

Egypt. Through these experiences with the illiterate poor, he gained insight into the culture of the Middle East – insight that informed his reading of the culture of the Bible. The result is an interpretation of the Biblical story that makes it come alive in new ways. This study will also be offered on Sundays beginning on Feb. 17 at 9:40 a.m. in the Christian Perspectives Class.

Lenten Discipline #1

This has been a busy morning already. The newspaper Tuesday morning says that Tennessee preachers can carry guns in the pulpits. (Really?) A friend at the gym this morning, who was also at church last Sunday, declared that our early hour in the gym was his mountaintop experience. You know the kind of morning; you're having one, too.

Oddly enough, there is the quieter voice that keeps whispering through the noise of the morning: "Listen." Just that; one word: "Listen."

I remember that when Jesus was transfigured on the mountaintop, God the Father spoke from the cloud, "This is my Son; listen to him." Listening as a Lenten discipline is the listening of the heart.

We spend so much of our time talking or keeping the TV on just for the covering noise it makes. All this noise makes it hard to listen. We spend so much of our time planning our next job or writing the next sermon (whether you're a preacher or not) or what we are going to say at the afternoon meeting. All this noise makes it hard to listen. Listening is stopping all our noise and turning off the other noises that fill our day.

Listening is waiting. Sometimes we have to wait in an attitude of listening for God to speak. God will rarely shout over our busy sounds. Something about conversation with God will not compete with any other voices. So, we wait with quieted mouths and hearts for the coming of the God who speaks. I must warn you, however, that sometimes God comes but chooses to sit with us quietly – as old friends can sit and inhale a silence together.

For this first week of Lenten Discipline, I recommend spiritual listening. Still the noise within and without, and wait upon the Lord. Set aside a time for listening – five minutes or fifty. And do just that.

8 Come, behold the works of the Lord; see what desolations he has brought on the earth. 9 He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow, and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire. 10 "Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth. (Psalm 46:8-10)
