Healing Service This Sunday

In the letter of James, the writer asks, "Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven." (James 5.13-15).

Christians are invited to pray for one another; we know that already. Further, Christians are invited to pray for the healing of those who suffer or need healing. More than the vague suggestion that we send positive thoughts out to those who suffer, this invitation comes with God's promise: "The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up."

This Sunday morning at worship, we will pray for those who suffer and stand in need of healing.

• We will pray for those in physical distress of every kind whether in the hospital or at home, as you prayed for me when I was in the hospital.

• We will pray for those with long-term illness and treatments such as cancer requiring chemotherapy.

• We will pray for those who grieve and those whose grief has already begun.

• We will pray for those who are a part of our church and those whom God has laid heavy on our hearts.

• We will pray for those whose trust and most important relationships are broken.

• We will pray with children who are worried about the grown-ups in their lives; we will pray with parents about their children.

Mainly, we will pray in the confidence that God will keep the promise the Apostle James made: "The Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven." In this prayer, we join with God to heal the people and the communities that are precious to us.

The Sunday services this week will offer prayers for healing of every kind. We will pray as a congregation during the worship hour. There will be time to share individual concerns with one of the pastors after each service.


I hope you will take time to share your ideas and prayers with the staff. We have a few weeks before we go. Make sure that we have your thinking before the retreat begins on July 30.
